The first Baltic UrbCulturalPlanning Conference *Urban Transformation through Art and Culture* is happening in Kiel: a gathering of urbanists and city planners, artists, researchers and academics, students, community organizers, politicians and activists, to explore key aspects of taking an art and cultural perspective in urban strategies and practice. It is a transdisciplinary approach, which is being reflected in programme of the conference. The starting point is to think in an integrated and connected way. Only then can we discern the linkages and dependencies that help us understand the deeper dynamics of cities and how to make the most of our potential. One of the main challenges is how to reinvigorate public and shared commons. The city, as a dynamic system requires a more holistic approach. Having a human dimension, civic creativity, social capital and the civic city as starting points for city planning, would assemble the core values of cultural planning. *“The city affects us, and we affect the city, it’s bloody obvious - everybody is a citymaker”* (Landry, 2018)
